The Advocacy & Events Associate is a new full-time role for a creative individual with approximately three years of relevant experience with a passion for creating a more just funding ecosystem for community organizations and grassroots activists around the world.

Location: Remote, Global outside of the US, Canada, or Western Europe in the Global Majority/Global South—with the ability to overlap 12-16 hours per week within the working hours of 8 am-12 pm Eastern

time. For GFC's work, this may include candidates in Eastern Europe and Eurasia.

Languages required: Professional level fluency in English

Salary: Dependent on location, available benefits, and experience; minimum salary is \$1500 USD per month

Advocacy in Philanthropy

We are in an exciting moment to <u>re-imagine philanthropy and global development</u>—from trust-based philanthropy to participatory grantmaking, from #Shiftthepower to decolonization—never have there been so many calls for change from within and outside philanthropy. Greater equity is in reach and we want to be part of that tipping point towards change.

Inspired by our <u>commitment</u> to trust-based philanthropy and community-led change, in 2022 GFC convened a group of partner and youth leaders to share their priorities for change in the funding ecosystem and design an influencing strategy. We are now ready to activate our shared strategy and amplify grassroots leaders' calls for change. Their priorities include making funding more accessible, flexible, and contextualized; ensuring funding partnerships are long-term and include organizational strengthening; and shifting evaluation to be more human-centered. This role helps GFC commit to a participatory strategy and campaign process with our partners and other key stakeholders.

These calls for change build on GFC's fundamental commitment to shift power in our own policies and practices as a trust-based funder. To date, some of GFC's internal changes include creating grantee feedback mechanisms; simplifying applications and reports; funding unregistered groups and individuals; forming advisory groups including our Youth Leadership Council and our Partner Advisory Group; co-designing with partners;

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and facilitating participatory grantmaking with young people. This role helps us learn, reflect, experiment, and share to continue to influence through our values, learning, and actions.

We recognize we are part of a growing movement and allies are essential. GFC collaborates with peers and networks across philanthropy, including WINGS, Elevate Children Funders Group, Ariadne, Human Rights Funders Network, Grantmakers for Effective Organizations, International Education Funders Group, and Network of Engaged International Donors, among others, to learn and advocate for change. This role helps us to deepen our network connections, track developments in the sector, and take advantage of exciting opportunities.

About this Role

The Advocacy and Events Associate will join our dynamic Communications & Influencing team to work in collaboration across the team and most closely with the Director of Innovation & Influencing. Some of the role will be tailored to the final candidate to best harness their skills, experiences, and passions and complement the existing skills on the team.

Key elements of the role include:

Advocacy Strategy Co-creation (50%):

Champion strategy goals while centering grassroots leaders

- Co-facilitate a participatory strategy process that calls for changes in philanthropy
- Support or lead key strategy campaign activities—including virtual or in-person events, research, or digital content
- Develop and maintain relationships with GFC's grassroots strategy champions
- Mobilize GFC team, partners, peers and supporters to amplify campaign activities
- Coordinate logistics including calendar invites, materials, and work with consultants like interpreters/translators and graphic facilitators
- Support learning between meetings/workshops, including organizing notes, recordings, and next steps
- Engage other key stakeholders like members of our Youth Leadership Council and Partner Advisory Group
- Offer training, mentorship, and support as needed
- Gather and document reflections, progress, and strategy outcomes
- Support new ideas and opportunities as they emerge



Innovation & Learning (20%):

Share new learnings and practices that advance community-led change

- Help foster space for GFC to question, experiment, and reflect on existing and emergent practices in grantmaking, capacity development, or community-led change
- Capture and share learnings for internal reflection or to spark dialogue in the sector
- Support or lead research that supports influencing efforts
- Participate in peer learning calls
- Maintain connection with the Programs team to learn about new developments in initiatives
- Build relationships with sector media and serve as a liaison to sector publications
- Conduct research for talking points and public-facing content
- Author or ghostwrite written pieces

Event and Conference Support (20%):

Design inclusive events and learning activities that inspire change

- Coordinate GFC's events calendar and activities tracker
- Support or lead the design and logistics of GFC events, including webinars, conference sessions, and inperson events or workshops
- Encourage the use of best practices in safeguarding, meaningful engagement, and DEIA (Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility), including growing our learning in these areas
- Collaborate with GFC team members, partners, and youth leaders to amplify diverse voices
- Facilitate timely financial and non-financial recognition to celebrate co-creators
- Ensure consistent follow up to events, including documenting and sharing learnings
- Represent GFC in event spaces—as a potential facilitator, speaker, or attendee

Sector Learning and New Opportunities (10%):

Help us stay connected to our networks and sector change efforts

- Identify new opportunities including sector events, campaigns, conferences, and publications
- Track and share trends in the sector, including the latest relevant research and tools
- Represent GFC in some network spaces, attending webinars and participating in learning journeys with a commitment to share key learnings internally



The ideal candidate

If you have been growing your skills in advocacy, love to bring people together in community, have a strong belief in building collective power, and are passionate about changes that move us towards equity in funding, we would love to hear from you!

The ideal candidate will be a representative of GFC's mission, embracing our <u>Core Values</u> of Courage, Passion, Partnership, Learning, Inclusion and Excellence in their daily work.

We know the right person may not be equally experienced in all aspects of the skills listed below so we are committed to providing training and development. We are looking to hear from exceptional candidates who can demonstrate strong skills in most of the following areas in their application and interviews.

Essential:

- Approximately three years of experience in creating advocacy strategies and carrying out campaign tactics. This may include community organizing or mobilization, research advocacy, grasstops engagement, digital campaigning, leadership development or movement building. We will also consider substantive experiences as an activist, volunteer, or intern.
- Some experience in planning all aspects of in-person and virtual events or workshops, including design, logistics, facilitation, and promotion
- Find joy in collaborating and creating with others with a passion for participatory practices
- Deep belief in building collective power and encouraging community and youth leadership
- Commitment to the wellbeing and safety of activists, youth, and children, including following GFC's safeguarding policy
- A curious learner who is eager to ask questions, reflect, and generously connect with others
- Willingness to be proactive in identifying issues and taking initiative to find and enact solutions
- Ability to express ideas in English in a fluent, clear and concise way, both orally and in writing, to communicate advocacy goals, learning, and research, etc. to diverse audiences
- Proficient in web-based technology, including Zoom, and social media
- Ability to work remotely, travel, and meet physical requirements:
 - Remote work: Access to reliable internet connection with sufficient speed for video calls and to upload and download large files (We understand short-term power or internet outages may happen from time to time in some countries).
 - o Travel: Ability to travel internationally and maintain a valid passport. This position will likely require travel four weeks out of a year.
 - Physical requirements: This position requires constant computer work with repetitive motion and long periods of sitting. The physical demands of this position are light with the expectation that



the team member can exert up to 20 lb. of force occasionally, and/or up to 10 lb. of force frequently, and/or a negligible amount of force constantly to move objects. Light work usually requires walking or standing to a significant degree. GFC will make reasonable accommodations in compliance with the US Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

Desirable:

We are especially excited to hear from applicants with one or more of these experiences:

- Experience working with youth and/or grassroots leaders with a dedication to using meaningful engagement or participatory practices
- First-hand experience applying for funding and navigating power dynamics in philanthropy, grantmaking, or global development
- Digital content creation skills like graphic design or audiovisual production, including with artivism
- Advocacy experience within the United Nations or European Union system or with bilateral donors (e.g. USAID, FCDO, SIDA, etc.)
- Experience in developing learning or advocacy materials
- Speak a language from a country where GFC works and has grantee partners

Working at Global Fund for Children

- 3) Tell us about an event or workshop (online or in-person) you have organized. What was your role? What was its purpose and its results? What did you learn from the experience? How did you ensure it was a meaningful and inclusive experience for participants? (1-2 paragraphs)
- 4) Writing sample: Please share a previously created written material you authored. This could be a blog, zine, an event invitation, a press release, an article, a toolkit, or another professional or academic writing sample. Please upload a file or include a link in the spaces provided. We do not expect a writing sample to be perfect or professionally copyedited.
- 5) Optional design sample: If available, please upload a file or share a link to a file or image that shows something you've created with design elements. This might be a graphic for social media or a website, an infographic, a poster, or a reel or video you created, for example. We do not expect you to be a graphic designer but are interested in seeing your interest and eye for creative content if that's something you have experience in.
